

Symbolic Ideas Students Can Incorporate Into Their Paths To Represent Challenges They Encountered:

Rocks or Boulders – Represent obstacles that made their progress more difficult, like time management or specific art skills. **Storm Clouds** – Symbolize moments of frustration, discouragement, or setbacks they faced during projects or assignments.

Puzzles or Locks – Reflect things they found confusing or difficult to understand, like new art concepts or techniques.

Hills or Mountains – Represent larger, ongoing challenges they had to climb, such as balancing schoolwork with personal responsibilities.

Traffic Signs (like "Stop" or "Yield") – Indicate places where they felt slowed down, such as by needing more practice or extra help.

A Maze – Shows a time they felt lost or unsure of the direction they were going with their work or understanding.

A Broken Pencil or Eraser Shavings – Represent moments of frustration with drawing skills, like mistakes or things they had to redo.

Closed Door – Could represent times when they felt limited or blocked, whether by their own skills or external factors.

Fog or Darkness – Symbolizes feeling uncertain, overwhelmed, or unmotivated at points throughout the quarter.

Symbolic Ideas Students Can Incorporate Into Their Paths To Represent Success They Encountered:

Stars or Trophies – Represent achievements, like completing a project well or learning a new skill.
Sunshine or a Rainbow – Symbolize positive breakthroughs, like moments of clarity or enjoyment in their artwork.
Flower or Tree Growth – Reflect personal growth, skill improvement, or progress in understanding concepts.
Open Door – Represents new opportunities or understanding, such as mastering a technique or discovering a new interest.
Footprints – Show steady progress and persistence, even when facing challenges.
Compass – Symbolizes finding direction or gaining confidence in their artistic choices.
Bridge – Represents overcoming a challenge or connecting different skills learned throughout the quarter.
Thumbs-Up or Checkmark – Symbolize completion of a task or project with satisfaction.
Bird in Flight – Shows a sense of freedom, creativity, or confidence gained in their work.
Light Bulb – Represents moments of inspiration, new ideas, or creative problem-solving.

Symbolic Ideas Students Can Incorporate Into Their Paths To Represent Changes They Hope To Make For The Next Quarter:

Compass or Map – Represents a sense of direction and intention for staying on a clear path toward their goals.

Butterfly or Caterpillar – Symbolizes personal growth and transformation, especially if they want to improve in certain areas.

Bridge Under Construction – Shows a desire to build connections or improve areas where they feel incomplete or less confident.

New Pathway or Fork in the Road – Represents making a new choice or taking a different approach to reach better outcomes.

Seedling or Sapling – Symbolizes the beginning of new habits, skills, or behaviors they want to grow over time.

Compass Rose – Represents navigating new strategies or staying focused on their goals as they move forward.

Open Book – Shows a readiness to learn more, stay curious, or practice new techniques.

Hourglass or Clock – Reflects a desire to better manage time or stay on task with projects.

Eraser – Represents letting go of past mistakes or reworking their approach for a fresh start.

Anchor – Symbolizes a need for stability or grounding, perhaps by setting consistent habits or staying more organized.
